Northern Policy Institute launches Northbynumbers.ca, which has census data from 2001-2011

Northern Ontario data is now just a click away.

The Northern Policy Institute announced Tuesday the launch of Northbynumbers.ca, an interactive data tool that displays Northern Ontario census data from between 2001 and 2011.

Northbynumbers.ca was commissioned by the Institute in partnership with North Superior Workforce Planning Board. It was designed by the Sault Ste. Marie Innovation Centre in conjunction with the research team at Institute.

"The interactive map allows users to search census data using a variety of search topics and characteristics," a release from the Institute said.

Some of the search topics include: dwelling characteristics, Aboriginal identity, education, income, labour force, mobility and population and age.

"Users can then define a variable, year, and geographic region based on the search topic," the release said.

Geographic regions are divided into census divisions (districts), census subdivisions (communities) and dissemination areas (neighbourhoods).

"Northbynumbers.ca brings together all the census data for Northern Ontario and presents it using an easily readable, easily accessible, and easy to learn tool," says Institute president and CEO, Charles Cirtwill.




