

#### SKILLED TRADES WORKERS EARN MORE IN GREATER SUDBURY



In Northeastern Ontario, wages for heavy equipment mechanics, welders, and millwrights are between 10 and 20 per cent higher than the provincial average



Overall, compared to the Ontario average, median wages for skilled trade workers are approximately **4 per cent higher** in Greater Sudbury

| Heavy equipment mechanic              | \$35.28/hour         | \$30.00/hour  |
| Welder                                | \$30.00/hour         | \$24.00/hour  |
| Millwright                            | \$35.00/hour         | \$32.50/hour  |
| Median wage for skilled trade workers | \$26.67/hour         | \$25.65 /hour |
